Subject: opposed to annexation (Fee-To-Trust) of camp 4

My Husband and I are residents of Santa Ynez. We live in Rancho Estates and have so for 36 years. Our property backs up to Camp 4. I have attended all of the meetings concerning camp 4. I also keep all of the homeowners in Rancho Estates updated on Camp 4. It has been said that because the attendance at these meetings are not crowded with concerned citizens that maybe there aren't that many people that are truly concerned. At one point I took a petition around to all home owners in Rancho Estates concerning Camp 4 . All but 1 out of 90 plus willingly signed. They were not in favor of camp 4 being placed into Fee-To-Trust or the development that the tribe has planned. I believe that many people feel that they are being represented at these meetings by all the leaders of the organizations that have taken the lead in the fight to stop this assault on this beautiful Valley. So please don't just count the numbers in the room.

I writing to register my strong opinion that the Ad Hoc Subcommittee and the County should not in any way condone or offer Fee to Trust (FTT) nor violate the Williamson Act on any property owned by the Band. This is the stated position of the Board of Supervisors as established by Board action on a 4:1 vote on October 15, 2013. The Board did not extend authority to the Ad Hoc Committee to negotiate Fee to Trust. The current FTT discussion is completely inappropriate without a return to the Board to reconsider their October 15, 2013 position in a full public hearing.

The current offer in the Term Sheet of FTT and zoning changes must be abandoned immediately, and full public participation allowed before previous public votes and Community Planning are unilaterally upended without the proper authority.
