WHEREAS, The women of the United States were once treated as second-class citizens, denied certain rights and privileges, and still struggle for full equality today; and

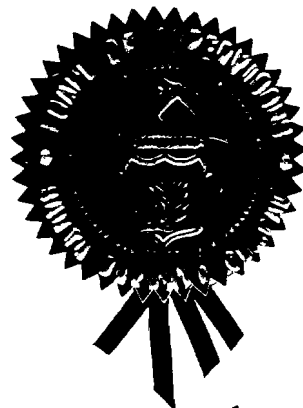
WHEREAS, On August 26th, 1920 the United States Congress ratified the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, granting women the right to vote; and
