Chief Probation Officer Comments – Tanja Heitman

1. Recommendation to Amend the Proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019 Realignment Budget

California's bail reform initiative, as well as the Humphrey's Decision (United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit Case: 17-17545) and local implementation of the associated review process, will significantly increase the numbers of cases subject to the Pretrial Supervised Release Program. Consider a recommendation to amend the proposed FY 2018-2019 Realignment budget to include two (2) additional Deputy Probation Officer positions to effectively respond to the increased referrals.

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2. Public Safety Realignment Local Plan FY 2018-2019 – Kim Shean

Each county local Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) shall recommend a local plan to the county board of supervisors for the implementation of public safety realignment. The plan shall be voted on by the executive committee of each county's CCP. The plan shall be deemed accepted by the county board of supervisors unless the board rejects the plan by a vote of four-fifths of the board, in which case the plan goes back to the CCP for further consideration. (*Section 1230.1 Penal Code (PC)*)
